SHERIFF JOHN D. IDLEBURG AB MIKVA LEADERSHIP AWARD

Sheriff John D. Idleburg attended Zion-Benton High School, and after graduating he joined the U.S. Marine Corps. After Sheriff Idleburg completed his service he returned to Zion, where he



was a union worker at Johnson Motors, and in 1977 left to join the Lake County Sheriff's Office as a Sheriff's Deputy in the Work Release Camp in Zion. Always looking ahead for a better future for his family, he left the Lake County Sheriff's Office for the Great Lakes Police Department. He rapidly went from a street cop to the detective bureau.

Sheriff Idleburg steadily rose up the ranks and in acknowledgement of his hard work he was invited to work with the U.S. Department of Defense as a Special Investigator. After several years of dedicated work, he

joined the U.S. Treasury Department as a Special Agent.

After three decades, Sheriff Idleburg retired from federal service and union participation. He enjoyed retirement for a few months, but with much left to give, joined the Lake County Forest Preserve, Zion Park Police, and Lake Forest Hospital. He served as Post Commander for the American Legion Zion Post 865 for 4 years. He is the past President of the Illinois Police Association, current Commissioner for the Police and Fire Commission in Zion and the Lake County Housing Authority.

As Sheriff since 2018, John has successfully worked towards increasing the community's trust while being responsive to the expectations of law enforcement during a critical time in our country. As a result, Governor Pritzker appointed him to the Illinois Law Enforcement Training and Standards Board, which oversees the training and continuing education of all law enforcement across the state.

Sheriff Idleburg has dedicated resources to aggressively pursue trafficking in all its forms (guns, humans, drugs) to keep our community safe. As a result, Sheriff Idleburg's Special Investigations Group set new records in 2020, seizing nearly \$3 million worth of illegal drugs and 55 illegally possessed firearms, resulting in a total of 350 felony charges.

Sheriff Idleburg developed and launched a Criminal Justice Community Council to provide an ongoing collaborative forum between community members and organizations and criminal justice government representatives with the goal of strengthening community-law enforcement partnerships, ensuring community members have a voice in the criminal justice space. Sheriff Idleburg embraces the philosophy that the community and the community's voice always set the guiding principles of our criminal justice system.

Sheriff Idleburg resides in Zion with his wife, Pam, and is a proud father and grandfather.

2021 FOUNDERS AWARD—LAURIE SCHILLER

Dr. Laurence (Laurie) Schiller is a longtime volunteer with Tenth Dems, and a valued member of the leadership team. Over the years, Laurie has contributed extensively to *Tenth News*, the group's longtime monthly newsletter, and is a major part of our Democratic Communications Team. Laurie also serves as the Dean of Tenth Dems University (TDU). In that capacity, he helps organize and host TDU's local political programs with featured speakers and facilitates our *Let's Talk Politics* conversations.

After graduating with a BA in African American and African studies from Rutgers University, Laurie received his Ph.D. in African History, with a minor in the Islamic Middle East, from Northwestern University and taught there as an adjunct professor of history for more than 35 years. While at Northwestern, he took over a small fencing club team and created an elite women's varsity program, retiring in 2016 after nearly 40 years as Head Coach and the second-winningest fencing coach in the history of the NCAA. Laurie has been elected to the Northwestern Athletic Hall of Fame. He and his wife Cathy live in Deerfield.

2021 ROSENBLIT VOLUNTEER AWARD — JUDY DOLINS

With her background as a high-powered executive and advocate for children, it is no wonder that in retirement Judy Dolins, MPH, found a home with Tenth Dems and soon became a valued member of the leadership team. Judy does whatever needs to be done to further Democratic goals, from running weekly leadership meetings to overseeing phone banks to organizing delivery of t-shirts, and much, much more. She also finds time for painting, collaging, and beading.

Judy retired from her career with the American Academy of Pediatrics as the Academy's Chief Implementation Officer and Senior Vice President for Community and Chapter Affairs and Quality Improvement. Among many achievements, Judy developed a highly successful state government affairs program teaching pediatricians to advocate for children's health issues. She also was responsible for community pediatrics programs and health equity initiatives. She was invited by the U.S. Department of Homeland Security to serve on the United States Immigrant and Customs Enforcement Advisory Committee on Family Residential Centers, which issued a report stating that no child belongs in detention.

Judy received her undergraduate degree from Stanford University and earned a master's degree in public health from the University of North Carolina. She and her husband Steven live in Highland Park.

In 2003, the northeast corner of Illinois was strongly Republican. But then Tenth Dems was born. Starting with a dozen Democrats working out of a living room, we have grown into a group of thousands working all around the 10th Congressional District, fighting for our Democratic values.

With the help of Tenth Dems, many Democrats have been elected and reelected to the U.S. Senate and House, the Illinois state legislature, county offices, judgeships, and local offices.



How does Tenth Dems do it?

We support candidates.

Tenth Dems has identified and recruited candidates for various offices. Those candidates know we can help by providing volunteers, giving the candidates and their staffs campaign training, and offering ongoing free consulting during the campaign.

We host phone banks, organize door-to-door canvasses, stuff and label envelopes, walk in parades, design and mail campaign literature, and analyze election data to target key voters.

Tenth Dems has raised many millions of dollars to help elect Democratic candidates in our area.

We bring people into the political process.

Tenth Dems grows because our volunteers reach out to recruit new people and manage the volunteers already with us. Not only have our volunteers gone on to become staff for candidates and elected officials, many have become leaders of grassroots organizations and run for office and won.

We recruit and train volunteers to register voters and provide information about when and where to vote.

Our large internship program also gives young people opportunities for civic engagement.

Sometimes we just get folks to show up to rally for a cause or to protest a policy, which lets people know there is a home for them too.

We keep people engaged.

Thousands are reached by our weekly Events List, a simple tool to keep track of what's happening nearby.

Tenth Dems University is an ongoing program of speakers that educates voters, inspires more active and effective political volunteers, and teaches skills needed to run for public office.



Our *Let's Talk Politics* is a series of moderated discussions where Democrats in and around the 10th District talk about current issues. These events often feature elected officials, candidates, political analysts, and authors.

We have rallied activists on health care, our environment, a woman's right to choose, and other issues.

We value voting rights.

The best campaigns still need to win votes. When democracy is threatened by voter suppression, it hurts all of us. Our Election Protection Team of over 125 lawyers ensures that every voter who is *entitled* to vote is *allowed* to vote.

We make our community a better place.

Tenth Dems believes that politics is about more than just elections: it's the process of working together to improve our neighborhoods, state, country, and world. We offer job interview training, hold expungement seminars, and sponsor an Annual Poetry and Prose Contest for students. Our offices throughout the district offer a place for residents to meet, talk, and organize.

We get results.

We help elect Democrats to every level of office in every part of the 10th Congressional District, from Waukegan and Zion up north, to Fox Lake out west, down to Mount Prospect and New Trier Township, and many places in between.

What seemed far-fetched when we began has become reality. Thanks to the hard work of so many, Democrats have been elected and re-elected to the U.S. Senate and House, as well as to the Illinois state legislature. Previously overlooked campaigns for county offices, judgeships, and local offices have seen significant Democratic victories.
