



2020 Judicial Election Voting Guide

For voters in Ela, Fremont, Libertyville, and Vernon Townships

With Donald Trump poised to replace Justice Ruth Bader Ginsburg with yet another right-wing extremist, it has never been more important to elect judges in our community who share our values. Depending on where exactly you reside, your ballot may include the race for the 3rd subcircuit as well as several judges who are facing retention votes on whether they should hold office for another 6 years without voters having the opportunity to vote for other options. We encourage you to do your own research, but here are our recommendations on how you should complete these portions of your ballot.

SUPPORT:

Marnie Michelle Slavin is the Democrat running for judge in the 3rd subcircuit. She serves on a local school board, has been endorsed by pro-choice organization Personal PAC, and is committed to fairness and equality for all. We urge you to join us in voting for **Marnie Michelle Slavin**, who we are confident would be a highly qualified and exemplary judge for the people of Lake County.

VOTE NO:

There are several Republican judges running for **retention**, which means that if 60% of us vote “yes”, they will serve another 6 years on the bench without having to face a Democratic opponent. The voters deserve a choice about who serves us in the judicial branch, so we are recommending that you VOTE NO on these judges for retention:
